There are certain items every MV should carry along for those minor emergencies when you are driving to a show or on a convoy or just plain driving around enjoying the day. As I was making notes for this article I thought I'd check my M37 and see if I had the necessary items in there. I flunked very badly. I had way too much or nothing at all.

It's understandable that some vehicles can carry more items than others. A Jeep can't carry as much as an M37 and a 5 ton can carry a spare car in the back without noticing the bulk. So you have to take all of this with a grain of salt and pay attention to the size of your vehicle.

FIRE EXTINGUISHER: This is a must but few people carry one. It would make you sick to watch your vehicle or your buddies go up in flames when a small extinguisher could have put out the fire. I carry three in my M37. I've used it once and it saved my shop.

RAIN COAT: This is more important if you drive an open cab vehicle for obvious reasons. I was carrying three so I put two back in the closet.

UMBRELLA: This goes along with the rain coat. It's more important in an open cab vehicle. I had six in my truck. Now I'm down to three.


