Book Review "Panzer Commander" By Ron Powell

"Man, horse, and truck, by the Lord were struck".

Colonel Hans Von Luck served in the German army during WW2 as a Panzer Tank Platoon, Company, and Battalion Commander. In his memoirs, he had on three occasions recalled these words in his witness of three particularly horrific battles. According to Hans, the poem (above) is in reference to the battles of the crusaders in Palestine about 1213.

The destruction he witnessed occurred first when he served on the Russian Front near Moscow in 1941. The second occasion was in North Africa under Field Marshall Erwin Rommel's Afrika Corps. And finally, as German forces retreated at full speed from France after D-Day, Hans lamented the total destruction of the German army in the Falaise pocket.

At the conclusion of this last battle, he knew then of course, that the war was lost.

Note: Colonel Hans Von Luck felt great compassion for the Soldiers on all sides during WW2. He felt the war was wrong, and he despised Hitler, the SS, and anti-Semitism. However he did his duty as a professional Soldier of the German regular army. He spent 5 years in a Russian Gulag and was released in 1950. He maintained long lasting friendships with many of his former enemies. He died in 1997.
