#### "Spearhead, a book review". By Benjamin Sterling

Now the bestselling author Adam Makos who wrote A Higher Call and Devotion has brought us into the gunner's seat of a M4A1 Sherman has the 3rd Armored Division pushes across Europe into Germany.
